

## **Relationship: Genesis 2:4-25**

**AIM** For people to know that our God is a relational God, he made us for relationship with Him and to serve Him together.

## PRAY & READ Genesis 2:4-25 together

- 1. <u>IN PAIRS</u>: What do you notice is different between this second creation account and the first?
  - <u>TOGETHER</u>: What do you think the author wants us to understand from the differences?

## Us & God

- 2. What does this passage show us about the nature of the relationship between God and mankind?
  - What does this teach us about:
    - Mankind's purpose?
    - The way we should relate to God? (see Colossians 1:16)
    - o The way God works in His world?
- 3. What are all the ways God provides for Adam? What does this show us about his character?
  - How does this context help us understand God's commands in verse 16 & 17?
  - How does this help us as we consider the life that Jesus calls us?

## **Us Together**

4. From Genesis 1:26-27 we know that God created mankind – male & female – equally in His image.

- What other details from this account suggest man & woman are equal?
- What details in this account teach that man & woman are different?
- 5. In 2:18 the woman is described as a "helper", in what sense(s) is woman a helper to man? (1:28, 2:18)
  - Get someone to **READ** Malachi 2:15
    - What does this verse say about why God brought man and woman together in marriage?
    - How does this help us better understand God's command in Genesis 1:28?
  - **READ together** Ephesians 5:22-33
    - How does the Gospel shape our reading of Genesis 2?
    - How does this expand our application of God's command in Genesis 1:28?
      (what we are to do, and who we can do it with)
- 6. What does all we've considered teach us about the relationship between men & women?

If you have time, you could pick one of these questions to draw out more:

- What might God's creation of Adam first and Eve from Adam teach us about how men & women ought to relate to each other in marriage?
  - What is the significance of this order being present in the garden?
  - How could this appropriately be applied to relationships outside of marriage?
  - How might it be inappropriately applied?
  - What other biblical texts could we look at to help guide us in this?
- What is the bible's teaching on sex? (What it does, its significance, who it's for, what its purpose is?)
  - How is this different to what our world says
  - How could this explain much of the relational pain in our world?
- 7. We are made for a relationship with our God. How conscious are you of this reality? How could you be more?
- 8. We are together made to serve our God and His purposes in this world.
  - What opportunities do you have currently to serve God?
  - What are some ways you could seek out more opportunities?
