



Luke 3:21-4:13: Fulfillment, The Son of God

A key idea - Trust this Son of God, the one in whom all God's plan will come to fulfillment

Context: Jesus hasn't really been the main character yet in Luke, but what do we already know about him?

Read Luke 3:21-4:13

1. What strikes you from this passage?
2. Let's break into pairs or threes. Try and work out if there are different sections and a title for them. Come back together and share your thoughts on the sections and titles.
3. In those groups split up these different passages (you might need multiple groups to cover the same sections)?
 - Read the passages and discuss the point Luke is trying to make about Jesus.
 - Come back and share together

4. How do you see both Jesus' human weakness and his Spirit-empowered strength?
5. What might it look like to respond to temptation like him?
 - a. What truths motivate him?
 - b. What affections drive him?
6. How does this passage help us to see that Jesus is the saviour we need?
 - a. What encouragement is it to know that we have his righteousness?
 - i. How might it address the guilt we carry?
 - ii. How might it address our insecurities in our relationship with God?
(Or: how do you think God sees you?)

Pray together that we would never lose sight of Jesus, the one in whom God sees us as righteous.
