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Study to do with parents:

Read Luke 13: 22-30

1. What question did Jesus get asked? Is it an important question?
2. Explain the story in verse 25-27 in your own words.
3. Why does the owner not open the door for some of the people? What verse do you see that in?
4. Where will these people go who don't know God? How do you feel about that? Why do you feel that way?

5. What verse shows us that Jesus wants us to be in the kingdom with God?

Application:

6. Do you know God? Do you make every effort to be friends with God?

(We know that there is nothing we can do to get to heaven, Jesus has done it all. All we need to do is trust in Jesus. But if you know that God loves you so much he sent Jesus to die for you, why

wouldn't you want to be friends with God. Why wouldn't that be the most important friendship in your life?)

7. Are there people in your life who aren't friends with God? Who are they? How could you tell them about Jesus and how awesome it is to be friends with God?

Thank God that through Jesus we can be friends with him. Ask God to help you put effort and time into your friendship with God. Ask God for help when talking to your friends about Jesus.
